

Car show to help veterans in college



MiraCosta College's annual Car and Motorcycle Show is set for May 6.

The seventh annual event put on by members of the college's Automotive Technology Program is expected to feature dozens of cars. The show gives MiraCosta automotive technology students a chance to showcase their craftsmanship and mechanical abilities and brings together area car buffs.

The event is open to any car or motorcycle and there are no year or make/model restrictions. Categories include hot rods, classics, tuners, trucks, customs, choppers and rat rods along with unrestored originals and works in progress.

Festivities include live music, awards and drawings. Local high school students are slated to compete in a go-cart contest. Food and beverages will sold.

The fee to exhibit a vehicle is \$20 on the day of the event.

Proceeds from the event will go to the college's programs to help military students and veterans along with Extended Opportunity Programs.

"The event goes a long way toward helping military and EOPS students afford textbooks and bolster our scholarship funds," said event coordinator Steve Vail, automotive

technology instructor at the college.

The car show is from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the college's Parking Lot 1A, 1 Barnard Drive on the Oceanside campus.

The event is free for spectators; free spectator parking is in lot 2A.
