BEFORE YOU COME:

Create a Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID), if you have not done so already. The FSA ID gives you access to Federal Student Aid's online systems and allows you to sign your FAFSA electronically. If you created an FSA ID for a previous FAFSA, you have completed this step. If not, log onto fsaid.ed.gov and follow the instructions.

If you are a dependent student, one of your parents will also need to create a FSA ID in order to sign your FAFSA. If neither parent has a Social Security Number (SSN) they will be unable to obtain a FSA ID and will sign your financial aid application by printing a signature page from your FAFSA.

WHAT TO BRING: *(create a file for copies of all financial aid documents submitted)*

For 2019-20 FAFSA or Dream Act Application bring:

- Photo ID—preferably driver's license
- Your Social Security Card or Alien Registration Number (ARN), if applicable
- If you are a dependent student: Social Security Number, birthdate, and legal name of parent(s)
- 2017 federal and state income tax returns
- 2017 W-2's, 1099's and records of money received from other taxable benefits
- Current bank statements or bank balances from all accounts
- Business, farm, and other real estate records
- Stocks, bonds, and other investment records
- Records of untaxed income; for example, child support, veteran non-education benefits, workers compensation, disability, etc.

If filing 2018 income tax return, bring:

- Photo ID – preferably driver's license
- 2018 W-2's and 1099's from all employers
- 2018 Interest and Dividend statements
- Birthdate for you, your spouse, and dependents
- Social Security Numbers (SSN) for you, your spouse, and dependents
- If you file taxes but do not have a SSN, you may apply for an Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN).
- Proof of foreign status, if applying for an ITIN
- All 1095 forms – Health Insurance Marketplace Statements (Affordable Care Act)
- If daycare was paid in 2018, bring total paid and the daycare provider's SSN or business's EIN.
- Proof of bank account number and routing number (such as a blank check) needed for direct deposit.
- If filing status is married filing jointly, both spouses must be present to file electronically.

Federal and state tax returns will be processed for free for taxpayers with income of \$66,000 or less. Taxpayers with income higher than \$66,000 may have their returns processed at the event for a fee.
