Complete registration for summer first and then complete registration for fall.

Student ID numbers (also known as SURF IDs) are required in order to use the online system, prior to registering for classes. SURF ID numbers are NOT sent to the students. 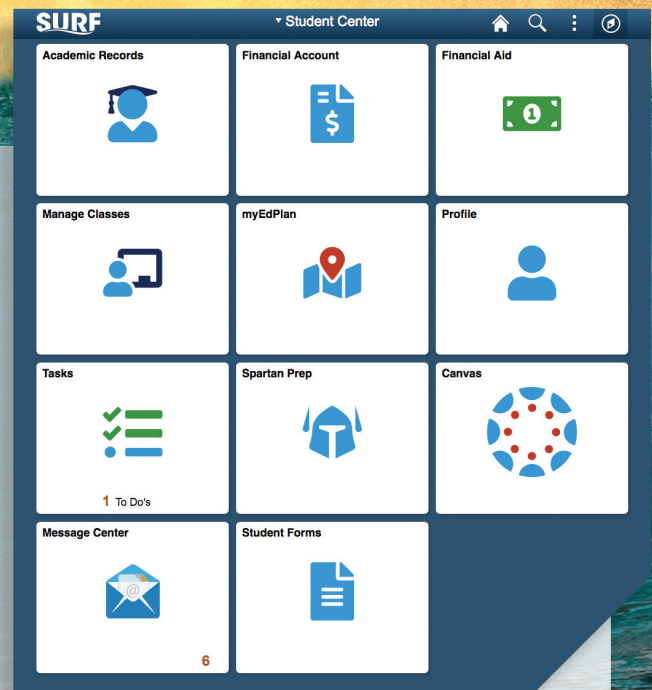

### Residency and Proficiency

To earn the diploma, students must demonstrate residency with at least 20 credits in attendance. They must also earn proficiency in English and mathematics through the successful completion of three AHS courses:

- HSENG 16–English Grammar 2
- HSENG 25–English 4
- HSMTH 21/HSMTH 30–Algebra 2/Geometry or the equivalent

*\*Specific college credit courses may also be used to meet residency and proficiency requirements.*

### Noncredit Certificates

Certificates of Competency help students demonstrate achievement through the completion of a series of courses for personal or professional development, or as milestones of achievement in the pursuit of a diploma.

- Basic Education for Academic or Workforce Preparation, 3 classes
- Certificate of Competency: English Fundamentals–Grammar, 2 classes
- Certificate of Competency: English Fundamentals–Reading, 2 classes
- Certificate of Competency: English Fundamentals–Writing, 2 classes

# MORE THINGS TO KNOW



## Adding/Dropping Classes

Changes to your class schedule may be made online using SURF ([surf.miracosta.edu](http://surf.miracosta.edu)) or in person\* at the Admissions & Records Office at the Community Learning Center. You will not be mailed a confirmation of registration. Students are responsible for officially dropping a course. If you decide not to continue in a class for which you have registered, it is your responsibility to drop the class officially by using SURF or by submitting a drop card to Admissions & Records.

\*NOTE: As of the date of production of this schedule all campuses are closed due to COVID-19. Please check the MiraCosta College website prior to coming to campus to ensure that we are open: [miracosta.edu](http://miracosta.edu).



## Attendance at First Class Meeting & Wait Lists

To ensure your place in a class, attend the first class meeting. Instructors may drop absent students to make room for students wishing to add the class from the wait list. While registering in SURF, students may select the wait list option for a full class. Beginning on the first day of classes, student registration into classes will be at the discretion of the instructor. The student must attend the class on the first day to be issued a permission number or have an add card signed by the instructor to register in the class.



## Testing Services

Testing Services offers a variety of services to students and non-students. Students can utilize the center to complete their credit placements, ESL CASAS appraisals, and access certain DSPS testing accommodations. As a PearsonVue-certified Test Center, the center also offers GED testing to students taking GED preparation classes. Additionally, the center offers proctoring services for non-MiraCosta students and community members. ## Class Cancellations

Classes may be canceled due to insufficient enrollment. Every attempt will be made to contact students by email before the class meets. Students do not need to drop a canceled class.



## Parking Permits

Parking permits are required when parking at the Community Learning Center (CLC), Oceanside, and San Elijo campuses Monday-Saturday. All vehicles not displaying a valid permit will be ticketed starting Monday, June 15, for summer session and August 31 for fall semester. Students may not park in staff spaces. Parking permits may be purchased for \$17.50 for the CLC or \$35 for the Oceanside or San Elijo Campuses. Parking permits purchased for the CLC are not valid at the Oceanside and San Elijo campuses. Vending machines that sell day passes are located at all three campuses. A CLC day pass may be purchased for 50 cents and the San Elijo and Oceanside Campus day passes may be purchased for \$1. All visitors must purchase a day pass Monday-Saturday. Parking permits are non-refundable once purchased.

# THE OVERVIEW

## A Brief Description of Classes



### Adult High School Diploma

MiraCosta College's Adult High School prepares adults for higher education and increased employability in a supportive, challenging, and accessible environment that respects and honors diversity. Upon entrance into the program, each student's previous coursework, skill levels, and academic and/or professional goals are determined in order to provide an individualized plan for goal attainment. Students must earn a total of 160 credits, with at least 20 credits in residence.

### Career & College Preparation

MiraCosta College offers career and college preparation for students who wish to increase their skills in preparation for college classes, for employment or advancement in the workplace, or for personal growth. These courses are offered in a variety of ways, including open enrollment, face-to-face, hybrid, and 100 percent online. (An open enrollment class means that students may enroll at any time throughout the semester.) Academic Skills classes include NCABE, NCENG and NCMTH. Workforce Preparation classes include NCWFP, NCNURS and NCVOC 42, 43, 50.

### Noncredit ESL (NCESL) English as a Second Language

The MiraCosta noncredit ESL program offers students a variety of learning opportunities to achieve proficiency in the English language and formulate and attain personal, academic, vocational, and/or civic goals. The noncredit ESL program provides seven levels of ESL at the Community Learning Center during morning, afternoon, and evening hours, and on the weekends. The program also offers citizenship, career-track ESL, conversation classes, computer and digital literacy classes, reading and writing skills-based classes, and open-entry distance learning. Classes are also offered at schools, community centers, and libraries throughout the district.



## General Noncredit

The goal of adult education in California is to provide citizens of every age and educational level the opportunity to develop civic responsibility, a realization of the human potential, effective human relationships, and economic self-sufficiency. This broad goal forms the basis for the courses and programs MiraCosta College offers in each of the authorized categories of tuition-free noncredit instruction. General Noncredit continuing education at MiraCosta College includes the following areas:

### Basic Skills for Adults with Developmental Disabilities

Courses specifically designed to provide individuals with life-skill proficiencies that are essential to the fulfillment of academic, vocational, and personal goals for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Enrollment in Disabled Students Programs & Services (DSPS) is encouraged prior to registration. Please contact 760.795.6658 for more information.

### Health & Safety

Courses specifically designed to offer lifelong education to promote the health, safety, and the well-being of individuals.

### Older Adult

Courses specifically designed to offer lifelong education for the older adult population that provide opportunities for personal growth and development, as well as skills for mental and physical well-being.

### Parenting

Courses specifically designed to offer education in parenting, child development, and family relations in order to enhance the quality of home, family, career, and community life.

## Short-Term Vocational

Noncredit Short-Term Vocational instruction includes business office computer applications, automotive technology, and introduction to health care courses that prepare students for entry-level employment. # TYPES OF CLASSES

For summer and fall, our classes are offered in three formats: online, scheduled online, and hybrid. Classes in all three formats meet the same academic requirements. Students should be familiar with each format before registering to ensure they choose the classes that best fit their learning styles and academic needs.



**Scheduled online** classes at MiraCosta College meet online using a live videoconferencing tool (such as ZOOM) at the days and times indicated in the class listing. These classes may have additional instruction, coursework, and activities to be completed online.



**Hybrid classes** at MiraCosta College require both in-person meetings\* and online activity that takes the place of some "seat time." For example, if a class meets 50 percent online, a student may attend class two days per week and complete an additional two days worth of instruction and coursework online.



**Fully online** classes at MiraCosta require all instruction, coursework, and activities to be completed online. Classes offered 100 percent online have no face-to-face requirements.

*\*In-person meetings can take place at the Community Learning Center or at a designated off-site location, so students should note the exact location of all classes before registering.*

## What is ZOOM?

The **scheduled online** classes will utilize an online, live videoconferencing tool called ZOOM. Classes in ZOOM can be accessed for free on most computers, tablets, or mobile devices. It is recommended (but not required) to have a webcam and microphone if you are using a computer.

These classes are fully online classes that have a set schedule of specific days and times when students should be prepared to interact with their instructors, just like they would have in a face-to-face class.

Scheduled online classes will require that students be online at the same time as their instructors (synchronous instruction) for some of their school work, and other times students will work on their own time and at their own pace (asynchronous instruction).



**To ZOOM, students can use a phone, tablet, or computer.**

\*Each class will have its own ZOOM and URL log-in information provided by the instructor.

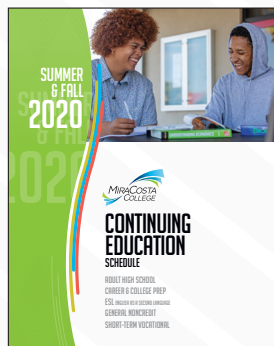

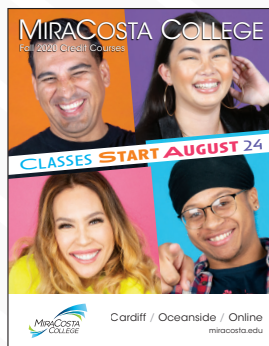
