


The MiraCosta Community College District mission

CONTINUING EDUCATION

MiraCosta College's Adult High School prepares adults for higher education and increased employability in a supportive, challenging, accessible environment that respects and honors diversity.



The MiraCosta College Adult High School (AHS) is designed for students 18 years of age or older who wish to complete the requirements for a high school diploma or prepare to take the GED or HiSET exam. Some classes are also appropriate for individuals who wish to increase skills in preparation for college course work, employment or advancement in the workplace, or personal growth. Those under 18, who can benefit from instruction, are also allowed to enroll. Any student enrolled in a day high school (regular or continuation) must meet the following criteria in order to take classes at MiraCosta's Adult High School:

- They must be a credit-deficient student, 15 years of age or older.
- 2 Day high school students must also present a Concurrent Enrollment Permit signed by their day high school principal, counselor, and parent.

HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY PREPARATION

For students interested in an alternative to the diploma, we offer a free preparation course for the GED and HiSet exams. Students will be given free textbooks, as well as Free test vouchers, after demonstrating regular attendance and participation. MiraCosta College is a certified GED testing site. RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS

Any student planning to receive an Adult High School Diploma must complete 20 high school credits in residence at MiraCosta College, either in Adult High School Diploma classes or in college credit classes.

COMPETENCY REQUIREMENTS

Students must demonstrate competency in reading, writing, and mathematic skills in order to receive MiraCosta College's Adult High School Diploma. Upon entrance into the program, students will be invited to attend an orientation and registration session, as well as a counseling session where they will learn about our classes/program. Using a multiple measures approach, counselors will make class recommendations based on each individual student's past transcripts, strengths and weaknesses, academic and career goals, and more. The amount of time and the number of classes it takes to earn our diploma varies, but for some, it can be done in as few as 4 classes!

ATTENDANCE & PARTICIPATION

Regular attendance and participation are important to student success in our program. Excessive absences, serious lack of academic effort, or unsatisfactory conduct may be basis for dismal from a course. Students who are struggling are encouraged to take advantage of the many free student support services provided by the program.

IMPORTANT TOOLS

SURF is our online Enrollment and Student Information Management portal that allows our students to manage their academic activities such as adding and dropping classes, checking final grades, retrieving transcripts and looking at their Edplans. COURSE DELIVERY FORMAT



Face-to-face classes require in-person weekly meetings* Students receive in weekly meetings*. Students receive inperson instruction and may be assigned homework to complete online or outside of class.



Hybrid classes at MiraCosta College require both in-person meetings*and online activity which takes the place of some "seat time." For example, if a class meets 50% online, a student may attend class two days per week and complete an additional two days worth of instruction and coursework online.



Fully online classes at MiraCosta require all instruction, coursework, and activities to be completed online. Classes offered 100% online have no face-to-face requirements.

*In-person meetings can take place at the Community Learning Center or at a designated off-site location, so students should note the exact location of all classes before registering.
