If score is less than < 62% on 1st attempt, applicants need to contact the program director to arrange a meeting to establish a remediation plan. Remediation plans developed by other nursing programs will not be accepted. When applying to the program, applicants are required to upload an unofficial TEAS score report with their online application. Additionally, an official TEAS score report must be sent to MiraCosta College directly from ATI prior to the end of the application deadline.
