**SUBJECT:** ARREST AND CONTROL/ SCENARIO TRAINING

**SYLLABUS:** 2 SEPARATE GROUPS OF 3 OFFICERS WILL PERFORM THE FOLLOWING:

- 10-15 MINUTE WARM UP/ STRETCHING FOR OFFICERS AND BRIEFING WITH DISPATCHERS
- 1 ½ HOURS OF SCENARIOS
- 10-15 MINUTE DEBRIEFING WITH OFFICERS AND DISPATCHERS

### **GOALS/ OUTCOME:**

- When deciding to use any restraint, officers should balance officer safety concerns with factors that include but not limited to (P&P 302.3):
  - The circumstances or crime leading to the arrest.
  - The demeanor and behavior of the arrested person.
  - The age and health of the person.
  - Whether the person has a hearing or speaking disability.
  - Whether the person has any other apparent disability.
- Control devices may be used when a decision has been made to control, restrain or arrest a subject who is violent or who demonstrates the intent to be violent, and the use of the device appears reasonable under the circumstances. When reasonable, a verbal warning and opportunity to comply should precede the use of these control devices (P&P 303.3).
- Officers shall use only the amount of force that reasonably appears necessary given the facts and totality of the circumstances known to or perceived by the officer at the time of the event to accomplish a legitimate law enforcement purpose per 835a of the Penal Code (P&P 300.3).
- As time and circumstances reasonably permit, and when community and officer safety would not be compromised, officers should consider actions that may increase officer safety and may decrease the need for using force (P&P 300.3.6).
