**c. Advocacy Academy Report**



Members who attended the Advocacy Academy will share the valuable insights and key takeaways they gained from the conference.

- Kathryn Reese: Highlighted a workshop on tailoring surveys to specific topics, emphasizing how to identify students' real needs—especially housing needs for community college students.
- Kathryn Wilken: Attended a storytelling workshop and discussed an anti-racism resolution, focusing on how to address these efforts across all 116 colleges.
- Arash Nawaey: Participated in a student housing workshop and worked with public advocates. Shared insights on writing resolutions and emphasized the value of networking with community colleges. Noted that a community college representative from Colorado helped plan student housing for their campus.
- Ceara Carson: Provided clear, step-by-step guidance on the resolution process and demonstrated how to transform student voices into action.
- Alexander Aurich: Emphasized the value of storytelling, particularly the importance of vulnerability when communicating student needs.
- Aryana Graff: Discussed the relationship between research and student government, noting that researchers should introduce themselves to ASG and share data. Encouraged inviting ASG representatives to participate in discussions on data and surveys.
- Stephen Beck: Found the experience very insightful, particularly for students-at-large.
- Ian Polo: Outlined three key goals: equity, academic success and access, and basic needs. Focused on resolutions and discussed challenges at other campuses where some goals were not achieved due to funding limitations.

### **ASG Standing Rules**

1. Members will wear their name tags at all ASG events (and meetings), or if participating in a virtual event, they will update their name and ASG role as their title (ex: update name on zoom to: “Name, ASG role”).
2. Members will exercise respect and civility inside and outside of the Student Senate.
3. Members will limit their use of electronic devices in ASG meetings to the business of ASG, such as agendas or agenda attachments.
4. Attendance:
  - a. Members are allowed two total tardies/ two early departures (not present for  $\leq 25\%$  of a meeting). Members are allowed two total absences per semester (not present for  $> 25\%$  of a meeting).
  - b. After two absences, members must appear before the Executive Council to explain their reasoning. If Exec votes to keep members, they will be allowed the opportunity for one more absence under extenuating circumstances (former absences remain on record). If members fail to provide extenuating circumstances in advance (if possible), they will be automatically removed from the office and can reapply for a position.
